HOW DID WE GET STARTED?

TBPA was founded in 1946 in Great Britain by the parents of British women who married American and Canadian servicemen during and after World War II. These women left their homes by the tens of thousands to join their husbands



in North America and eventually founded branches of the association throughout the United States and Canada. Today membership in TBPA is open to women and men of British birth and their descendents to all future generations.

WHY BECOME A MEMBER?

Membership in TBPA is not only a way to keep your British traditions alive but also a way to connect with other Brits across North America. In addition to your local Branch Meetings, Area Meetings are held with neighboring branches. A biennial Convention is also held so that members may meet in fellowship and be “Together Again”



HOW CAN I BECOME A MEMBER?

- Join an existing branch, or a new branch can be formed with as few as 5 members.
- Join as a “Postal Member” - there are two types of postal membership: Area Postal or General Postal Membership.
